When my girls were little and if I had to go away somewhere, even if it was for just a few hours, I would get them both together, on either side of me and explain to them that I was having to go away for a little while (with their dad of course most of the time !!), but they were never to feel scared or alone because their Nana would be coming to look after them. They were to listen to what she said and be good and obey her. There would be *why's* and *where's* and *do you really have to's*, but they knew that their Nan, my mum loved them so very much that they would feel safe. They always ended up having the best time of their life. This reading somehow reminds me of that but only in an infinitely more reassuring way.

Jesus was leaving his disciples, they were scared, He was explaining to them in so many ways that He was going away and going away forever; but they would always be safe because He was not going to desert them, His Father in heaven would give them comfort because His Father knew how they were feeling. This would come to them in the form of the Spirit who would dwell in them if only they followed what He had taught them, if only they listened to Him and if only they could keep the faith. Amazing - till today a promise made and a promise kept. Let us come firmly to the Lord, let us try to listen to His teaching; try to follow the way He taught us to live and tell Him we believe and let us claim the blessed Comfort of the Holy Spirit!!

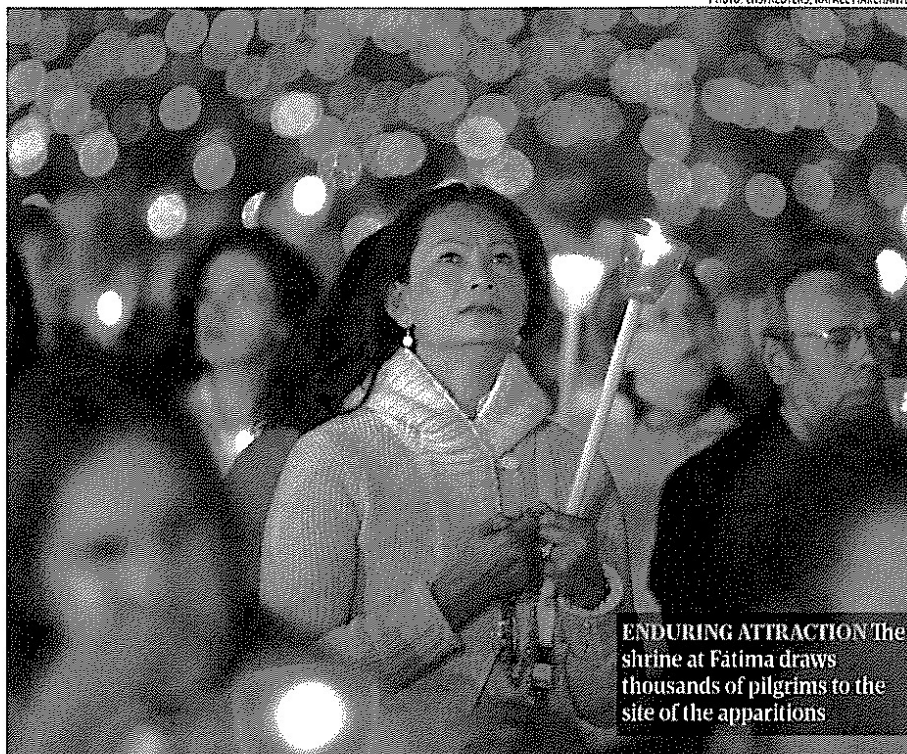

Seeing is believing

The experiences of child seers like Angela Volpini, the Italian girl who had visions of the Virgin Mary between the ages of seven and 16 – and went on to become an influential figure in the spirituality movement – belong to Europe's past / **By CHRIS MAUNDER**

TODAY, the apparition shrine at Fátima celebrates the 100th anniversary of the first of six visions that took place each month from May to October 1917.

Pope Francis will canonise the two visionaries beatified by Pope St John Paul II in 2000, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, both of whom died as children. The cause of the third visionary, the main narrator of the Fátima story, Sister Lúcia, who died in 2005 aged 98, is under consideration in Rome.

The canonisations indicate the impact that Fátima had on the life of the Church in the 20th century. Many later apparitions of the Virgin Mary reflect some of the features of the events at Fátima, with origins in a time of social change and political uncertainty, and the promise of great miracles and even the famous "sun dance" phenomenon. One such case is that of Casanova Staffora, an Apennine village in southern Lombardy. The visions there began nearly 70 years ago on 4 June 1947 to Angela Volpini, then a seven-year-

old girl, now 76; I interviewed Volpini as part of the research for my book, *Our Lady of the Nations: Apparitions of Mary in 20th Century Catholic Europe*. These apparitions came at a time of acute uncertainty, when politicians from left and right were sparring over the leadership of post-war Italy. The events occurred at a site called Bocco, close to the village, and were attended by thousands of pilgrims as well as journalists.

The visions continued until 1956, by when Volpini was 16, although she has continued to play an active role in the spiritual life of Italian Catholicism. She has written several books and articles, lectures regularly on spirituality, and appears on national and regional television. The shrine at Bocco includes a church of reasonable size; a hundred or so metres below is a small edifice, a *cappellina*, containing a statue of Mary marking the site of the visions on the hillside. The beauty of the valley from the high vantage point of the shrine rewards the pilgrim climbing up from the road below, as it will have done back in

1947. Bocco continues to attract a good number of pilgrims; the Church has not formally given its approval of the apparitions but the Diocese of Tortona allocates a priest to celebrate Mass at the shrine.

Volpini experienced 85 apparitions over nine years and large crowds gathered to witness her ecstasies. On 4 October 1947, people including Volpini saw the sun move dramatically and appear to descend, as at Fátima. Mary's messages, as Volpini heard them, are optimistic about human potential in a way that anticipates later trends and movements in Catholic spirituality. She told me that this message was fully present in the first apparition, when she heard Mary saying: "I come to teach you the way of happiness on Earth". According to Volpini, "Mary is an icon of the history of humanity. All human beings possess the opportunity for fulfilment and entry into the domain of the divine, and Mary is the one in whom this is fully realised."

VOLPINI'S MESSAGES emphasised the maternal presence of Mary among the pilgrims, her assurance of success through prayer and conversion, and the need to establish a shrine – all common features of apparitions. As at Fátima, there were prophecies of a future miracle. In 1956, at the end of the apparitions, Volpini remembers: "Mary told me that the miracle would be an increase of public conscience and awareness. In 1958, I founded the organisation Nova Cana to help this process. Nova Cana attempts to focus people's attention on the coming of the Kingdom of God, just as the wedding at Cana was the manifestation of the divinity in Jesus. It is a centre for dialogue. I realised the need for a space in which people could reflect on their desire for fulfilment and come to know that it could be realised."

Nova Cana runs conferences, seminars, and courses and has initiated farmers' co-operatives in the regions surrounding Casanova Staffora. Nova Cana has also launched projects in Peru, Brazil, Turkey and South Africa.

"In the 1960s, I was invited by a group of bishops, mainly from Latin America, such as Helder Camara and Cardinal Silva Henríquez, to discuss the themes of the Vatican Council, which were very close to my vision," Volpini recalls. "Later on, I met Oscar Romero, who visited the shrine at Bocco."

Unusually for an apparition shrine, Nova Cana's work and mission is associated more with the left of the political spectrum; indeed, for a time Volpini felt alienated from the Church owing to a suspicion that her movement was tainted by communism. Volpini speaks of the importance of human liberation, although – despite having many contacts and supporters in Latin America – she does not associate herself with liberation theology per se. She does not identify with feminist theology either: "Only later did I realise that gender was an issue," she told me. "The message was one of liberation and human dignity; it was only interpreted by others in terms of feminism." Nevertheless, she agreed that being a
