## **Response to Minister Dutton's Ultimatum to Asylum Seekers:**

The following are some points to use as a rebuttal of Minister Dutton's recent announcement to Asylum Seekers to have their Applications for Asylum completed by October 1, 2017.

1. These people have been doing the right thing. Dutton claims they have just been sitting around not putting in their Applications but, up until a few months ago, many have not even been allowed to apply. When they did they ran into a huge waiting list for legal assistance to fill out their application forms.
2. The Application Process is incredibly difficult. It's a 40 page document requiring all sorts of certificates and forms. Without legal help it is impossible to complete.
3. The Legal Centres to help with these forms are stretched to breaking point. This new deadline is a disaster and demands that 7,500 Applications be processed in a few months by a limited number of already overstretched legal people. Asylum seekers are being robbed of a 'fair go'.
4. The people affected are our neighbours, colleagues, friends. Living here and waiting in a limbo, patiently waiting to be able to apply.
5. Minister Dutton knows all of this and that's why he is doing it. He is pushing Asylum Seekers to have their application completed by an impossible deadline, without legal assistance. It will cost people their safety.

## **Refugee Advocacy Network (RAN) - Petition available in our churches BRING THEM HERE AND LET THEM STAY**

This petition of the RAN draws to the attention of House (To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the House of Representatives)

- Australia's refugee policies are cruel and destroying lives, with a number of avoidable deaths in detention.
- People seeking asylum have the right to live with dignity and in safety in our community while their claims for protection are processed.
- We want our society to be compassionate and just for all people, including people seeking asylum and those granted refugee status.

We therefore ask the House to:

- Cease mandatory detention.
- Close the camps on Nauru and Manus Island.
- Process all claims for asylum in Australia in a fair and timely manner.
- Refuse to deport people to dangerous or life threatening situations.
- Replace temporary protection visas with permanent protection visas.

### THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL—Matthew 28: 16-20

***All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.***

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commandments I gave to you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'



### **50th Anniversary of the 1967 Referendum and the 25th Anniversary of the Mabo Decision**

I believe that as a modern nation if we are to move forward into a future of promise, we must recognise and celebrate our extraordinary long pass—this is an important spiritual journey for us all to take. *Michael*
