Reflection:

LOOK ME IN THE EYE

There has been a new T.V. series advertised, in which estranged/wounded/hurt people meet with the person through which their crisis or pain occurred. A stark empty room with two chairs is the setting; no words; no actions; no 3rd party; no gimmicks. By the power of eye contact alone, change emerges . . . tears, forgiveness, love. In today's Gospel, Jesus is on about the same thing - human relationships. And he knows that any break-down in human interaction inevitably affects community. Society these days is desperately anxious to preserve a person's right to privacy, to free speech, to political correctness, and anyone interfering is promptly told to 'm.y.o.b' So when is it the work of the Spirit to correct someone? To point out the effect their behaviour is having on others? To try to show moral leadership? The final verse of the Reading from St. Paul says it all -

LOVE IS THE ONE THING THAT CANNOT HURT YOUR NEIGHBOUR.

5. **Return** the prayer candle to your child on the day of his/her 1st Eucharist.

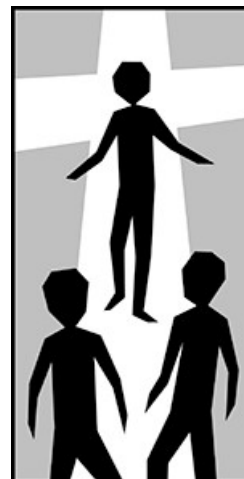

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL – Matthew 18: 15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between you two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'
