Reflection: Today's Gospel is self-explanatory - rare for a parable, the message is clear, simple...or is it? Forgiveness mmm... this is a good topic! *'Mum she took my doll, Dad he stole my ball and won't give it back, well she hit me, I did not!'*... sound familiar. Or perhaps at a later stage in life *'I can never forgive that injustice against me, it has hurt me too deeply and the behaviour is unforgivable - how dare they.'* I think perhaps we can all resonate with something along these lines at least at some level. Life is not easy and emotions are often tricky to manage. What is forgiveness actually about? Well actually it is about us! How we react and what we do with our emotions and feelings are some of the key concepts around forgiveness. We have many spiritual teachings from Jesus' to help us negotiate the situations we find ourselves in throughout our life time, and in particular that of the Golden rule is the number one spiritual lesson on love and forgiveness. Two wrongs do not make a right they just escalate a situation. To make a right, forgiveness is required...so, it is not about the other who we may think has wronged us, it's about how we react and then what we actually do with that reaction. How can we grow through this? We can and always will grow through forgiveness. We are all at different levels of development in regards to these life skills often depending what our life experience has been. Thankfully we no longer live in the era of an eye for an eye.... Remember what the Monsignor in Les Miserable said to the policeman when they presented Jean Valjean with the stolen silver advising he had the nerve to say you gave him this, 'that is right, but my friend you left so early...you forgot to take these also'...handing him the silver candelabra's. His life turned around because of the simple act of forgiveness.... and look what he then achieved in his life time. Forgiveness is powerful and heals, and bring us back into right relationship with God, with ourselves and with others. Try it!

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL – Matthew 18: 21-35

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times.'

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time," he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me", he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said. "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'
